SECTION 1

STAFF POPULATION - SUMMARY INFORMATION

Overall, the profile of the College staff population remains fairly consistent in most areas of equality references other than the proportion of staff recording as from BME communities. The decline in this area is due to the fact that we lost several members of staff in this group through natural turnover during the year.

The upgrade to the most recent version of our HR Database is in progress and should be complete for the start of the next academic year. This will improve our ability to record, monitor and have pro-active conversations with management across the College about all aspects of human resources including those related to equality and diversity.

Please note the data for 2014-15 include Stoneleigh Academy staff who represented 5% of the population.

The Principalship has reduced by two posts during the academic year and some restructuring took place across the academic management team, leading to a slight increase in this area but a reduction in Programme Leaders from 43 in 2016 to 14 in 2017. The Sector Managers in Work Based Learning are also now included as Academic Managers as we develop our programmes of study for students. This change has led to a more streamlined management which will take the College forward in delivering our strategy for 2017-18.







The Gender information has remained constant for some years and reflects the overall picture in education.





The proportion of staff reporting as Indian / Asian is much larger for this year's data. This is believed to be due to improved recording and reporting rather than a shift in the actual proportion of staff.

The data for Oldham from the 2011 census is included for comparison. The difference No Religion Specified data for the college is the probable explanation for the difference in the data recorded as Christian. Other than the area for Muslim as the recorded religion, the other data is similar to that recorded for the wider population of Oldham.

SECTION 2

STUDENT INFORMATION - SUMMARY INFORMATION

This section provides an in-year update on progress against Equality Objectives in line with the specific duties under the Equality Act 2011 relating to providing information about our students annually.

The content will demonstrate progress by using data comparisons from the last complete year (2015/16) alongside the current academic year 2016/17.

1. Student Applications

Table (1) below shows data for applications received in 2016/17 to date for entry in September 2017, and a comparison with the same data for applications received in 2015/17 for entry in September 2016. Counts have been converted to percentages to show relative proportions by ethnicity group.

The data shows the following:

- The proportion of white applicants (year to date) has fallen by 7%
- The proportion of Pakistani applicants (year to date) increased by over 5%. This was also reflected in offers made to Pakistani applicants which increased by over 5%.
- A small decrease in applications from Bangladeshi students (-0.87%) turned out a 2.3% decrease in offers (year to date)
- The proportion of white students whose applications converted to offers remained steady at 82% (small increase to 82.7% 2017/18). The figures for Pakistani and Black African were slightly below this, but applications from Bangladeshi students fell from 91.6% conversion in 2016/17 to 84.5% in 2017/18.
- Of those who applied for entry in 2016/17, conversions to enrolment were 53.6% for white students, 42.8% for Pakistani students, 41.7% for Black African students and 39.8% for Bangladeshi students.

2. Student Satisfaction

The EFA Learner Choices survey results include a breakdown by ethnicity group and learning difficulty. Table 2 below shows responses to two key satisfaction questions, i.e. degree of satisfaction with the way students are treated by staff, and overall satisfaction with the College. The scores in the tables represent an average score out of ten for each question.

The only significant variations in responses between years are those from mixed/multiple ethnic and other ethnic groups, which showed significant decreases in satisfaction in the current year compared with 2015/16. There is a small decrease in satisfaction (0.2) on both questions for students with a declared learning difficulty.

Of the known ethnic groups, the Asian group have responses which show least satisfaction with the way they are treated in both years, and the second lowest overall satisfaction in the current year ('other ethnic' are least satisfied in the current year).

3. Student Retention and Achievement

Table 3 below shows retention and achievement data for classroom-based learners, and includes data from the last three academic years.

The data shows the following:

- For all ages combined, retention fell over three years in all groups (except Looked After, which has very small numbers)
- In age groups, BME retention is higher than white, and significantly so for adult BME (6%)
- The decline in retention for 16-18 students with a disability is such that in 2015, students with a disability were retained less by a factor of 5%
- Achievement rate for students with a disability (all ages) is significantly less (6%) than for students with no disability.
- For the 16-18 age group, disabled students achieved 7% less than non-disabled students.
- For adult students, those from BME background achieve significantly better (9%) than white students.

Table 4 below shows achievement data for work-based learners, with breakdown by level, age and E&D group.

The data shows the following:

- For all levels of apprenticeship, BME students achieve significantly better (8%) than white students
- For all levels of apprenticeship, female students achieve significantly better (8%) than male students
- Timely achievement data shows similar characteristics to overall achievement, with an additional potentially significant differential (5%) between learning difficulty and none; however both results are very low (52% and 47% respectively) making this less significant
- Data is included for 2016/17, but this is not complete at this stage of the year

4. Destinations Data

The data on the following pages illustrates destination rates for the years 2014/15 and 2015/16. The first two tables show global destinations figures for the two years, and the remaining tables show destination comparisons over two years for BME, white, disability, male and female.

The data shows the following:

- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was a small increase (1%) of learners progressing to FE
- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was a significant increase (8%) of learners progressing to HE
- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was a decrease (3%) of 'no destination' learners

BME/white learners (tables 5c, 5d, 5e, 5f):

- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was an increase of 3% (to 7%) of BME learners entering employment; white learners remained the same at 9%
- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was an increase of 8% (to 63%) of BME learners progressing to further education; white learners increased by 3% (to 45%)
- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was an increase of 1% (to 8%) of BME learners with unknown destination; white learners increased by 2% (to 8%)

Disabled/non-disabled learners (tables 5g, 5h, 5i, 5j)

- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was an increase of 2% (to 10%) of disabled learners entering employment; non-disabled learners increased by 1% (to 8%)
- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was a decrease of 4% (to 48%) of disabled learners progressing to further education; non-disabled learners increased by 6% (to 53%)
- From 2014/15 to 2015/16, the progression of disabled learners to higher education remained the same at 10%; non-disabled learners decreased by 1% (to 14%)
- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was an increase of 3% (to 10%) of disabled learners with unknown destinations; non-disabled learners increased by 1% (to 7%)

Male/female learners (tables 5k, 5l, 5m, 5n)

- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was an increase of 2% (to 8%) in male learners progressing to employment; female students decreased by 1% (to 8%)
- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was a significant increase of 8% (to 54%) in male leaners progressing to further education; female students increased by 2% (to 52%)
- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was a decrease of 2% (to12%) in male learners progressing to higher education; female learners remained the same at 15%
- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was a decrease of 1% (to 6%) in male learners with no destination; no record is available for female learners
- From 2014/15 to 2015/16 there was an increase of 2% (to 9%) in male learners with unknown destination; female learners increased by 1% (to 6%)

5. Equality and Diversity in Teaching and Learning

Equality and Diversity is incorporated into teaching and learning in two forms:

- i. thematic delivery of E&D as a topic, either embedded in vocational sessions or added as a supplementary session e.g. through the informal learning curriculum
- ii. incorporated into teaching methods so that students are not disadvantaged through any characteristics of difference, and that all students have equal opportunity to achieve to their potential

The Observation of Teaching and Learning process makes a quality judgement of E&D in each observation, and records this in the College's 'ProObserve' database. The table below shows the rates of quality judgements for E&D in formal observations over the last three years:
